Claude Debussy (1862-1918) was born in St. Germain-en-Laye, France, into a working-class family. Identified as extremely talented from an early age, Debussy went to Paris Conservatoire when he was merely 10 years old to study piano, composition, organ, history, theory, and harmony with some of the most significant musical figures of the era. His brilliance at the piano was equaled only by his genius as a composer – although he was consistently described as combative against his rigid education and highly

experimental in his technique. Debussy instead sought new inspiration, and his influences include Javanese gamelan music, contemporary Richard Wagner, and a number of Impressionist poets and artists.

His influences were brilliantly applied to complete an impressive body of work: nearly 150 songs, including over a dozen song cycles; 38 piano works; 6 orchestral works; and 4 ballets. His most notable compositions include the symphonic poem *Prélude à l'aprèsmidi d'un faune*, "Clair de lune" from *Suite bergamasque* for solo piano, song cycles *Ariettes oubliées* and *Fêtes galantes*, and his lone completed opera *Pelléas et Mélisande*.

Debussy is considered one of the foremost composers of the Impressionist period, though he personally disliked that the term was applied to his music. He strove for and accomplished a complete synthesis of poetry and music with the words and their meaning as the primary determinant; and ingeniously utilized the elements of harmonic texture, tonal color, weight, and dissonance as a palette with which to paint fantastical worlds of music.

Master Clinician Dalton Baldwin

Pianist Dalton Baldwin is the Dean of American Collaborative Pianists. After training at the Juilliard School and receiving his Bachelor of Music degree from Oberlin Conservatory, Mr. Baldwin continued his studies in Paris with Nadia Boulanger and Madeleine Lipatti. Concentrating primarily on the song repertoire, Baldwin was personally coached by composers Francis Poulenc and Frank Martin. He is best known for his playing of the French repertoire, and has recorded the complete songs of Debussy, Fauré, Poulenc, Ravel and Roussel with various artists.

In 1954, Mr. Baldwin met Gérard Souzay and, for over three decades, they enjoyed an incredibly successful partnership. They toured together across five continents, and made numerous prize-winning recordings – several of which were released on compact disc to critical acclaim. The *New York Times* review of April 1995 cited their partnership as a "musical marriage made in heaven." In 1970, Mr. Baldwin began working with Elly Ameling, with whom he also performed extensively. Mr. Baldwin's recordings of Schubert and Schumann with both Souzay and Ameling have won numerous prizes, and are considered the gold standard of art song performance. In the mid-1970's, Mr. Baldwin began an association with Jessye Norman, both on stage and in the recording studio. He accompanied Arleen Augér's first New York recital in 1984, and then recorded with her the award-winning disc *Love Songs*. He has also accompanied many others, including Mady Mesple, Edda Moser, Jennie Tourel, Marilyn Horne, Frederica von Stade, Nicolai Gedda, José van Dam, William Parker, Norah Amsellem, and Steven Kimbrough.

In addition to his more than 100 song recital recordings, Dalton Baldwin has also played many world premieres – notably, Rorem's *War Scenes* in 1969 with Souzay. In 1987, Mr. Baldwin was awarded the Croix de Commandant de l'Ordre des Arts et Lettres by the French government. Currently a Professor of Accompanying and Coaching at the presitigous Westminster Choir College, he also taught at the Salzburg Mozarteum, the National Conservatories of Madrid and Paris, and the Nice Académie Internationale de Musique.

Eric Sedgwick, Pianist

Eric Sedgwick is a New York-based pianist, accompanist and vocal coach who has performed in concert with some of some of music's biggest talents, including Leona Mitchell, Marni Nixon, Sarah Rice, and Thomas Stacy. He is a staff coach at Manhattan School of Music, where he rehearses and musically directs Catherine Malfitano's performance classes. He also coaches and musically directs productions for the cutting-edge Opera-Works training program in southern California. Mr. Sedgwick performs regularly with several companies in New York City, including Opera Singer

regularly with several companies in New York City, including Opera Singers Initiatives, The Art Song Preservation Society of New York, The Stonewall Chorale, and Broadway Concerts Direct.
